As the revenue from light current for the month of January 1909 is \$675 .-75 this amount will decrease by whatever the discount may be on what is paid in the first five days in which discount is allowed. This is the largest monthly revenue from light current shown since the plant started.

My collection for light fund since January 7th is \$767.64 of which \$318.17 is on old current and wiring accounts, I must say with credit to the patrons of the city's water and light service that every bill presented was paid promptly, with a single exception, which was for a very small amount. The policy which the council has outlined and are following is sore to bring good results to both the city and citizens. As a total for my collection for the past 25 days are as follows:
