Ordinance No. 72.

Providing for the regulation, management and control of the Electric Light and Power System of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska and Providing for the Licensing of Electricians in the City of Red Cloud, establishing service rates to the customers and consumers of electric current, protecting the system from injuries, prescribing the manner of supplying current for lighting and power purposes, fixing penalties for violations of the provisions of this ordinance and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances of the City of Red Cloud conflicting with any of the provisions of this ordinance.

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Red Cloud, Nebraska:

Section 1. The Light Commissioner of the City of Red Cloud shall have the general control and management of its electric light and power system and shall have the immediate charge and control of all the property, appliances, machinery, materials and supplies provided for said system, and shall perform the duties required of him by the laws of this state and the ordinances of this city, in relation to said system, and such orders of the Mayor and Council pertaining thereto as may be made from time to time.

Section 2. The Mayor and Council shall, by resolution, provide for the employment of such engineers, electricians, linemen, helpers and assistants as they may from time to time deem necessary for the safe and efficient operation of the system, upon such terms and conditions as may be specified in such resolution, and all such employees working upon and about said system shall be subject directly to the orders of the Light Commissioner.

Section 3. The lines and circuits of the system shall be seasonably inspected and at all times maintained in good order.

Section 4. Street Lamps shall be burned according to "Philadelphia Moon Light Schedule," generally, but all street lamps shall be lighted on dark and cloudy nights, and the current for said street lights shall be turned on for use at such times as may be designated by the Light Commissioner. The current for the commercial and residence circuits shall be turned on and ready for use and shall be turned off under the direction of the Light Commissioner.

Section 5. For the government of the service and the regulation of the consumption of current, the following regulations and rates are hereby adopted and established.

1. All services, generally, shall be supplied with current at meter rates based on monthly consumption.

2. All applications for electrical service must be made on the proper blanks, which will be furnished by the city through the commissioner's office, upon request, and said application must be made by the owner of the property or his duly authorized agent, and state fully and truly all purposes for which it is required.

3. The city will run its service wires to the property of the consumer, if located upon a commercial line, and connect his wires thereto. Free of charge, provided such consumer's wires are properly installed, put up and safe and in good condition, by the Light Commissioner.

4. The consumer must have wiring done by any competent person or company, having the required permit from the city, but under no circumstances shall connection be made with the wires of the system of the city, except by an employee of the city, and said wiring shall be in accordance with the rules of the National Board of Fire Underwriters and approved by the Light Commissioner.

5. No permit shall be issued to any person to do wiring until such person shall make an application in writing to the City Council and before any such permit shall be issued the applicant shall execute and file with the clerk of the city a bond running to said city in the sum of five hundred dollars, signed by one or more sufficient sureties, to be approved by the city council; conditioned that the applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the city of Red Cloud from all damages caused by negligence arising from a failure to protect his work or by any unskilled work done or material used or by his failure to comply with the rules and regulations of this ordinance, and that he will be governed by the rules and regulations of this ordinance and shall also pay to the city treasurer the sum of \$25.00 as a license fee and file the treasurer's receipt therefor with the clerk; provided, said license shall continue in force for a period of one year from its date.

6. No lines, fixtures or appliances of the system are to be removed or altered except by an employee of the city.

7. The city will furnish electric current in accordance with the terms of contract for the full term thereof in accordance with these regulations, unless prevented by unavoidable causes, but expressly reserves the right to disconnect and discontinue such service for any of the following reasons:

First—For repairs necessary to be made on any part of the circuit.

Second—For non-payment of bills when due.

Third—For fraudulent representations in relation to consumption of current for light or power.

8. The consumer must use due care to prevent waste of current, and the city to protect its interests reserves the right to at all times have free access to the premises in which current is being used to investigate and deter-

mine if it is being carried, distributed and used in the proper manner and in conformity with the contract and the rules and regulations of the city governing such matters.

9. Bills for service and current are due on the first day of each month for the preceding month. A discount of ten per cent will be allowed on all such bills paid on or before the 10th of the month.

10. All bills must be settled at the office of the Light Commissioner on or before the 10th day of the month or the current shall be turned off without further notice. And it is hereby made the duty of the Light Commissioner to turn off the current of all delinquents.

11. Contracts are not transferable except with the written consent of the city and shall continue in force after the expiration thereof until ten days written notice has been given by either party to discontinue.

12. The city shall adopt the types and makes of meters and lamps to be used on the system and will furnish to consumers upon such terms and under such rules and regulations as the Mayor and Council may by resolution adopt and prescribe and no other meter or lamp may be used except of the type and make so adopted.

13. The city expressly reserves the right to change these rules and regulations from time to time as experience may prove needful and necessary.

14. All supplies sold by the city shall be sold for cash and no wiring shall be done by the city or its employees until a sufficient amount has been deposited with the Light Commissioner to cover the estimated cost of such wiring.

Section 6. The following is established as the tariff of rates based on monthly consumption to be charged consumers of electric current for light and power purposes viz:

COMMERCIAL RATES.

From 1 to 25 K. W. Hrs. 12 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 25 to 50 K. W. Hrs. 10 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 51 to 75 K. W. Hrs. 8 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 76 to 125 K. W. Hrs. 7 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 126 to 500 K. W. Hrs. 6 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 501 to 1000 K. W. Hrs. 5 cents per K. W. Hr.

RESIDENCE RATES.

From 1 to 6 K. W. Hrs. 20 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 7 to 10 K. W. Hrs. 15 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 11 to 20 K. W. Hrs. 12 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 21 to 50 K. W. Hrs. 10 cents per K. W. Hr.

From 51 to 100 K. W. Hrs. 9 cents per K. W. Hr.

Above 100 K. W. Hrs. 8 cents per K. W. Hr.

Section 7. The minimum monthly charge for current and service shall be \$1.00 for residences and offices and \$2.00 for business purposes, which rate shall include meter rent. For places using a large number of lights irregularly special rates and regulations will be made.

Section 8. It shall be unlawful for any person to tamper with, remove, injure or destroy any pole, wire, lamp, transformer, insulator, machinery, or appliances of any sort or nature in or about or belonging to said electric system or connected therewith or to make any connection with said lighting system or the wires thereof without a permit from the city as above specified.

Section 9. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not less than ten dollars or more than one hundred dollars and shall stand committed until such fine and costs are paid.

Section 10. All ordinances and parts of ordinances conflicting with any of the provisions of the foregoing ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
