**Ordinance No. 73.**  
An ordinance establishing and defining the fire limits of the city of Red Cloud and regulating the construction of buildings therein and repealing ordinance No. 20 of the city of Red Cloud.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Red Cloud Nebraska:

Section 1. That no buildings shall be erected within the following territory, to-wit: South half of block three (3) all of block four (4) all of block five (5) South half of block six (6) all of block twenty six (26) all of block twenty seven (27) all of block thirty (30) all of block thirty one (31) all of block thirty two (32) all in the original town now city of Red Cloud Nebraska and all of block one (1) south half of block two (2) in Williams addition to the city of Red Cloud Nebraska except upon permission first had and obtained from the Mayor and City Council of said city of Red Cloud as herein after provided and no permission shall be given for the erection of any building within said territory except the building to be erected shall be of brick, stone or cement with adequate fire walls wholly of brick, stone or cement with fire proof roof and each day continue in the erection of any building within said territory without a permit has been granted therefor shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

Section 2. Before such permit shall be granted the person or persons applying for the same shall make written application to the mayor and city council for a permit to erect a building which said application shall be accompanied by a statement giving a detailed description of said proposed building showing dimensions, material and the thickness and character of walls and roof.

Section 3. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to buildings of less value than twenty five dollars.

Section 4. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined in any sum not to exceed one hundred dollars.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with any of the provisions of the foregoing ordinance and especially ordinance No. 20 are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and adoption as required by law.

**Poultry Mites.**  
Now is the time to wage a warfare against the mites on the chickens, and in the coops. During the coming three months this plague will be at its worst. It is absolutely impossible for the chickens to do well for you, or themselves, when they are covered by vermin and in addition to securing more eggs on less feed, there will be fewer casualties in the flock.

Some farmers claim the very best thing to use is a kerosene emulsion in nests, cracks, straw and on the roosts, some going so far as to put it on the fowls. This is effective, should be done twice the first week and then about once a week for a month. Other liquid lice-killers are effective in their way, but as a general rule are very hard on the fowl treated, and we would advise that if same is used, to use only on roosts, dropping boards, cracks and crevices about the poultry house. One of the best things for the treatment of mites is fresh ground Persian insect powder.

Apply this powder by thoroughly rubbing it into the plumage of the fowl, holding it over a box to catch the powder which falls off. This is especially fine to use on setting hens as it is often an absolute preventative for several weeks after the treatment.

Always keep a nice, large box filled with fine, dry dust, such as is found in the road, preferably in a sunny place in the coop so that the fowls can dust themselves.

It is said that May chicks very seldom do well, many of them fail to live because of vermin when they are so feeble. In order to dust them occasionally take a 5-pound lard can, into which put a small handful of insect powder, put in 8 to 10 chicks, put on cover and quickly invert the can several times; then open and take the chicks out, continuing the operation until all are dusted.
