

water supply.-Journal. Smith Center. We thought that we were the only place on the map that was afflicted with inadequate water supply and a city administration. Cheer up brethren of Smith Center it will rain again.

The city fathers are making a dam across Crooked Creek. This will undoubtedly increase the flow of water in the wells for that has been the result whenever a dam was thrown across the creek. This should have been done a month ago. We regret that they have not saved money by making a permanent and respectable dam in place of the unsightly misfit which the first heavy rain will wash

Now that the creek can be turned in again in case of fire property owners will feel reassured. The papers of this city are a unit in regard to the water question and they undoubtedly voice the judgment of nine tenths of the people. Why give up methods known to be good? What this city wants is less tinkering and more business.

Those who have kept in touch with the electric light plant have seen the necessity of installing another engine for some time. That a small engine to help carry the night load will be conceded but we can see no necessity for installing a 100 horse power engine. That would be larger than needed for years to come to maintain a day current and the coal cost would be practically doubled. The argument that another engine of 100 horse power would lessen the cost is absurd as any one knows that it takes more coal for two engines than for one. We are of the opinion that a 50 horse power engine would be much better. If it takes \$4.00 worth of coal per day for 150 horse power engine how much will it take for two engines with a capacity of 250 horse power?
