




The advertisement complained of is that of the representatives of Chickering Bros., Thearle & Co., and its text is as follows:

Frank Chickering, which is not correct, yet it is a fact that Clifford Chickering did receive his training as a scale drawer from C. Frank Chickering, while F. W. Chickering remained in the factory at Boston, Clifford Chickering being with C. Frank Chickering during the scale drawing instructions in New York. So there is not much in the way of misstatements in that paragraph.

As to the request that there should be no confusion as to the products of the Chicago and Boston factories, that carries out the instructions of the court, and the Chickering Bros. state this in no uncertain terms on their pianos.

As to the old Chickering business in Boston passing out of the Chickering family, there can be no dispute as to that, and there is where the complaint of the Southern California Music Company fails flat—in so far as the telling of the truth is concerned.

There is a difference in the pianos of the two Chickering—a big difference. All that is necessary is for one to try the two makes, and that is soon apparent.

The MUSICAL COURIER EXTRA would like to help the Southern California Music House out of its dilemma as to which is the better piano, but probably the two houses can be induced to make a public demonstration as to the relative merits of the two makes.
