

Washington,-When asked if congress will adjourn early this year, the Republican leaders answer, "We will adjourn early if we can." Usually there is a sort of covert smile accompanying this answer, for congress can adjourn early if it will. The real situntion is that the controlling majority finds fiself in a peculiar position. It fears that if legislation is put through and if early adjournment comes, that the members will be blamed for not giving due thought to the bills that have been passed, provided any one of the bills proves to be weak when it takes on the form of law.

Another difficulty is that some of the congressional primaries will be held early this year and if congress makes a legislative spurt and does its work and adjourns, it may be said that there was hurry so that the members might get back to their balliwicks to look after their personal political fences. In the house by the adortion of a rule on each legislative suggestion, a bill can be debated and passed in a few days. The house is a law unto itself in this matter. In the senate, of course, there is no such thing as shutting off debate except by unanimous consent, but this will not be hard to obtain on any great measure, because no one man probably this winter will care to object to the vote on any one of the major measures the president has recommended.

"You ask me how to avoid having your pockets picked. Well, I don't believe any man can give advice on that subject. It is hard to tell what style a pickpocket is going to adopt. Usually he works in a crowd. The jam on the elevated stations is a good place, but there generally is a pair of fly cops on each of the loop stations at night, and the crooks know it. Then they get on the surface cars and work the platforms. Several of the recent jobs have been done that way.

"One of the commonest methods of stealing a diamond stud is to get them with a pair of pincers having a pocket into which the stone falls when it is cut off. The dip usually works from behind a newspaper. Of course, you can't watch every man with a newspaper on a street car, but if you have anything valuable about you, it is well to do so.

"A skilled crook may use a knife with razor-like blade to cut away the pocket. Keep your eye on the man who folds his arms. His hands may be at rest or they may be engaged in picking pockets.

"We call the man who robs women a moll buzzer. While the victim is looking in a shop window or standing in a street car he opens her hand bag and gets the leather. There are not many of these jobs any more, for women have become wise."


