To All Concerned.
 Complaint has been made to the Board of Education that merchants are selling smoking tobacco, chewing tobacco and cigars to minors. The patrons of the school look to the Board and its trustee officer for the enforcement of such laws, the violation of which impairs school discipline and school efficiency. The Board of Education hereby appends those sections of the Statutes pertaining to the sale of tobacco to minors and serves notice to all concerned that the violation of the same must be discontinued.
 BY ORDER OF BOARD OF EDUCATION.
 COBBEY'S STATUTES, LAWS 1909.
 Sec. 2361. Can not sell to minor.
 That hereafter no person, firm or association, or corporation in this state shall sell, give or furnish in any way any tobacco in any form whatsoever, or any cigarettes or cigarette paper to any minor under eighteen years of age.
 Sec. 2362. Penalty for violation.
 That any person, firm, association or corporation violating the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction thereof, for each and every offense, be fined in a sum of not less than twenty dollars and not more than fifty dollars, and costs of suit, or be imprisoned for not less than ten or more than thirty days, in the direction of the court.
 Sec. 2363. Unlawful to sell or give away cigarettes or cigarette paper.
 That it shall be unlawful on and after the date this act shall go into effect to manufacture, sell, give away or willingly allow to be taken any cigarettes or the material for their composition known as cigarette paper within the State of Nebraska.
 Sec. 2364. Penalty for violation of act.
 That any person, firm or association, or corporation in this state violating the provisions of this act or they shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction thereof be fined for each and every such offense, a sum not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 at the discretion of the Court together with costs of prosecution.
 Sec. 2365. Manager or director of corporation violating act—Penalty.
 Any officer, director or manager having in charge or control either separately or jointly with others the business of any corporation which corporation violates the provisions of this act if he have knowledge of the same, shall be guilty and subject to the penalty herein provided.
