



Sec. 2362. Penalty for violation. That any person, firm, association or corporation violating the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction thereof, for each and every offense, be fined in a sum of not less than twenty dollars and not more than fitty dollars, and costs of suit, or be imprisoned for Grade 6 not less than ten or more than thirty days, in the direction of the court. Sec. 2363. Unlawful to sell or give

away cigarettes or cigarette paper. That it shall be unlawful on and

after the date this act shall go into effect to manufacture, seil, give away or willingly allow to be taken any eigarettes or the material for their composition known as eigarette paper Grade 7within the State of Nebraska.




