We left Denver in the morning and spent most of the day going up the Royal Gorge of the Arkansas and arrived at the summit at about dusk. Of course the cenery up the gorge is grand but as it has been so often described I will not attempt its description. Seventeen miles east of The Dalles chutes flows. The Deschutes valley. of water. It is so swift that it is not ever fordable. A horse cannot stand where the water is over three feet deep. From its mouth up for 80 miles it has an average fall of 14 feet to the mile and can be crossed in but three places. It forms a portion of the boundry between Sluvman county and Wasco county. Slavman county is a great wheat and stock county and is a large Mr. Burwell appeared before the county about 50 miles long north and of stock you must remember that range in this country than there

> Wasco county of which The Dalles is the county seat is also a very large county being 50 miles long by 50 miles wide in its widest portion, though at one time it comprised nearly all the country east of the Cascade Range of mountains in Oregon. Wasco county produces wheat, cattle, sheep, timber and fruits. Most of the fruit is raised by the dry farming process. Of which will write more later. The country is very rough and is sparcely settled back from the river. I am informed though that the best lands are all taken. The price of land here though is high ranging from \$15 for the poorest to \$1500 per acre for the best improved land and then the lands are not all adapted either for fruits or 41 grains. Wheat is raised on the up 37 lands and hay in the bottoms as wheat would not do well in the bottoms. Each piece of land is adapted for cer-47 tain purposes and other things would 42 not do well. The average annual rain 44 fall at The Dalles is about 15 inches 36 and more than 90 per cent of that falls in the winter in fact the most of the 42 rain over the whole northwest falls 39 during the winter months.

After staying at The Dalles for about a week we, my son George and family came on down to Seaview. Wash., where we have been for the last three weeks enjoying the ocean breeze which by the way is rather chilly at times and one wants an overcoat on. We take long tramps to the fishing rocks, to Long Beach to watch the bathers and to Ihoaco where I visited a salmon cannery and saw salmon by the ton.

Tomorrow, Monday, we expect to visit North Head light house and the next day start for The Dalles. In the last three weeks we have had but two clear days in which the sun has shone and not a hot day. If I have time will write you more from The Dalles. Yours truly.
