These performances are visited by a large number of children and pictures have a fascinating way of appealing to children. If the pictures are vicious the effect on the children will be harmful. A short time ago there was a wild protest all over the country against picturing a certain prize fight on the ground that it was demoralizing but pictures of stabbing, killing, murdering and lewdness are permitted to be shown without a word of protest. In the cities some of these shows openly ask for patronage on the grounds that their pictures are only a little beyond the reach of the law. On the other hand there are plenty of pictures which instill patriotism, teach honor and self-respect, instruct, delight and entertain. The good ones are to be commended, the bad ones ought to be abolished. Whether the influence of the moving picture show is good or bad depends upon the picture.

Now that the state legislatures are about to convene it would be well for the reformers to look into the many gambling devices that are being used to cultivate the gambling spirit in the young. It is useless to denounce gambling at cards, at the wheel of fortune, and thru the lottery so long as slot machines and other games of chance are allowed to run openly. Gambling is one of the most fascinating of the vices and one of the most demoralizing. It is harder to reform a confirmed gambler than a confirmed drunkard, for while drink diseases the whole body, gambling robs the moral fibre of the man. It is not a matter of degree; the principle itself is wrong. It is destructive of morals to try to get something for nothing. Not only is the principle vicious, but it cultivates extravagance in the successful and crime in the unsuccessful. That which is won by chance is soon spent while embezzlement often follows gambling losses. Laws should be passed in every state prohibiting all games of chance and all schemes by which sales, compensation or words shall depend on chance, whether it be by throwing dice, the turn of a wheel or any other device. The authors of the booklet seem to imagine that because the capital is located at Lincoln that city is being built up at the expense of the remainder of the state and they want to pass the good thing around. Possibly in a few more years every hamlet in the state would be a thriving metropolis provided the capital was moved fast enough. They seem to think that the University would travel around with the capital and that in the near future we would have great houses of learning scattered all over this good state of ours and that traveling in Nebraska would be one great sight seeing excursion where one could study architecture at the meeting of every cross road. As a pipe dream this traveling people's college ought to appeal to the most vivid imagination.

The authors of the booklet advocate the plan of selecting some central spot where all the people of Nebraska would have the same distance to travel whenever they had business at the capital. As a matter of fact how many of our citizens have business to transact at the capital of this state? How many times a year are the farmers, the doctors, the business men compelled to go to the capital? How many times in your life, gentle reader, have you had occasion to leave your quiet home and travel to the great capital on state business? Most of the men who visit that place have their way paid by the state and the exact location of the state capital is of little concern. If they happen to be officials the longer the run the more mileage, if they happen to be boarders they would go to the boarding house anyway. But the geographical center is somewhere near Marvin and the authors should state frankly that they are working to have the capital located at Marvin where there is plenty of room to erect a new modern state building. Why leave the reader in doubt?

The reason we object to having the capital located at Marvin is that it is a little inaccessible. Unfortunately the railroads run east and west and very few of them run north and south so that if we were compelled to journey to Marvin on state business we would be compelled to hitch up the old grey mare and drive the greater part of the distance and by the time we returned we would possibly be unable to get out our Christmas edition on time. The reason why Lincoln is well located for the capital is because the trains run toward that city and they can carry the mail there without delay or danger. If we must change the location of our capital by all means let it be fixed at Marvin.

The population of the state of Nebraska is 1,322,214, according to statistics of the thirteenth census, taken this year. This is an increase of 125,914, or 11.8 per cent, over 1,064,300 in 1900.

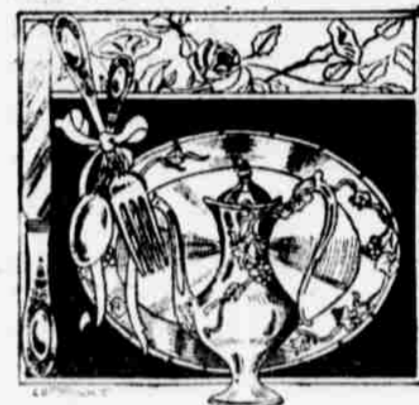
