**A Visit to the New Tie Barn**

We were down the other day and inspected the new tie-in barn. This barn is much larger than any structure of like character in this part of the country being 100 feet by 142 feet. There is plenty of room for one hundred teams hitched to wagons and feed stalls to accommodate them all. Farmers and others can drive into the barn and let their team stand without unhitching. The building is warm and well lighted and the accommodations as good as are to be found at home. A team placed in this barn is sheltered from the cold and storms and is ready to leave at a moment's notice and all for a very reasonable sum of money.  
 Mr. Bailey, the owner of the barn, has also fitted up a handsome office where the men can rest and warm themselves. He has also fitted up an excellent ladies waiting room. This room is warmed, has rocking chairs, a fine lavatory and sanitary toilet room. Here the ladies can be comfortable and have all the conveniences of a modern hotel without extra charge.  
 In walking thru this barn one is impressed with its bigness and its great convenience. As soon as its usefulness is learned there will be few teams found at the hitching racks during stormy weather. This is a new enterprise for this city but one which will meet the approval of every one who has any regard for animals. Mr. Bailey informs us that he will have the building practically completed by Saturday and will then be ready for business.
