#### Sulloway Pension Bill Passes House

Measure Grants Pension to All Union and Mexican Veterans and Adds Forty-Five Millions to Roil.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19-The house of representatives to day passed the Sulloway general pension bill which grants pensions ranging from \$12 to \$36 per month to all soldiers who served ninty days in the United States army in the civil war and who have reached the age of 62 years. The bill pension rall.
