"Bootleggers" Fined.

Lew Walter, Fred Bascom, W. K. Geer, Will Hayes and Walter Warren, the Red Cloud parties charged with selling intoxicating liquor without a government license, went to Hastings Monday, where they appeared before Judge T. C. Munger of the federal district court and pleaded guilty to the charge.
