Ordinance No. 80.
An Ordinance to Amend Ordinance No. 2
approved July 13th, 1900.
Be it ordained by the Mayor and council of
the City of Red Cloud:
SECTION 1. That Section 1 of ordinance
No. 2, approved July 13, 1900, is hereby
amended to read as follows:
"SECTION 1. The regular meetings of the
City Council of the City of Red Cloud, Ne-
braska, shall be held on the first Tuesday of
every month, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m."
SECTION 2. Section 1 of said ordinance, No.
2, is hereby repealed.
SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take
effect and be in force from and after its pas-
sage approval and publication.
