**COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS.**

Red Cloud, May 16th, A. D. 1911.

The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Members present L. P. Schmidt, G. Ohmstedt, Paul Storey, T. J. Chaplin and G. W. Hummel, Chairman of said Board.

It was moved and seconded that a steel bridge 30 feet long, 10 feet wide and Steel piling 20 feet long with cement floor and backing be built across Walnut Creek, in Walnut Creek Precinct near the school house in school district No. 3, in said Precinct. Motion carried.

In the matter of the Road and Bridge on section line, between Sections 19 and 30, Township 3, Range 11, and the petition of S. Sorenson and others, and in answer to the notice of said Board, now comes Henry Erickson and others and presents the following petition. To the Board of County Commissioners of Webster County. In the matter of the road and bridge on section line between Sections 19 and 30-31, and the petition of S. Sorenson and others. We the undersigned state that we know said bridge and road in its present condition and use the same frequently, and that they are in good condition for travel and as good or better than they ever were; that the bridge was raised in good faith, under the permission of the County Board, and the road is graded up to it in good shape, and we ask that it be allowed to remain as it is.

After due consideration of the facts presented by the petitioners for and against the lowering of said bridge and the removal of said cattle pass. It was moved and seconded the complaint as brought by the petitioners, S. Sorenson and others be dismissed providing the said Erickson and the signers of his petition, do agree that they will maintain the grades to said bridge and that the said Erickson does agree that he will be responsible to the County for any and all damages resulting from accident on account of the said cattle pass. Provided that when the said bridge is no longer used as a cattle pass and he has removed his fence to said his (Erickson) responsibility ceases. In witness whereof the said Henry Erickson signs the above and foregoing agreement this 16th day of May 1911.

In the matter of the taxes on lots 6 to 10 inclusive in Block 4 Morey's addition to Blue Hill, Nebraska. It was moved and seconded that the County treasurer be and is hereby authorized and instructed to strike the taxes on said lots from the tax list for the years 1908, 1909, 1910 the said lots being church property and exempt from taxes. (Motion carried.)

On motion the official bond of Fred Huppert was approved as overseer of Road District No. 7.

In the matter of the petition of Mabel Day and others to have water pipe laid about the Court House square in such manner that all parts of the lawn may be watered with the use of not more than 50 feet of hose. It was moved and seconded that the petition be and is hereby granted. (Motion carried.)

In the matter of the taxes on the south half of lot 5 and all of lot 6 in Block 6, LeDuc's addition to Red Cloud which was paid under protest, and a complaint made that said lots were assessed to high and requested the board to refund the amount over paid on said lots. Moved and seconded that the above and foregoing request be and is hereby rejected. Motion carried.

On motion Board adjourned sine die.
