Stallions and Jacks Must Have Certificates

The Stallion Registration Board is rganized under the new law with H. R. Smith. Professor of Animal Husbandry at the State University, as President: A. Bostrom, State Veterinarian, as the Vice President; and W.R. Mellor, Secretary of the State Board of Agriculture as Secretary, with office n State Capitol, Lincoln.

The Board will appoint two inspecters whose duty it will be to inspect all breeding stallions and jacks in Ne. braska. Under the new law every which will show all defects. Those August 15th, 1911. afflicted with hereditary, infectious, contagious or transmissable diseases. such as weithal gleet, melanosis, periodic opthalmia. lätyngeal hemiplegia or serious defect in general conformation will be denied a certificate. The board will give personal notice, or through the press, of the time and place at which inspections will be made within the county. Stallion and jack owners must present their animals for examination. The fee will be \$5.00, payable in advance. If an owner of breeding animals fails to present his animal for inspection at the time set, it will cost him \$10.00 to secure his certificate.


