


Mr. Edson was defeated at the primary by a large majority of the combined democratic and independent voters, but on the independent ticket Mr. Ranney received 76 votes and Mr. Edson 89, the latter having a majority of 13 votes. His remaining on the ticket is an act against all precedent all over the state. Mr. Wright of Rosemont also received a majority on the independent ticket for treasurer, yet he realized the fallacy of remaining on the ticket. Two years ago Mr. Arnold received the independent nomination for treasurer but withdrew and came feated him on the joint ballot Not only in this but all counties of the state it is understood that when a candidate is beaten by a majority of votes on the fusion ticket he is down and out.

Mr. Edson has been in office for ten years, yet one of the strongest planks in the platform of the party he now claims allegiance to is opposed to an official holding office for more than two terms. So you see, on every side he is inconsistent. He knows, and the people know that he cannot be elected. yet he wishes if possible by any means to injure the cause of the people's candidate and the democracic party.
