Harvard Professor to Talk to History Teachers

When the history teachers of the state meet in annual convention in Omaha on May 3 and 4, they will have the unusual opportunity of hearing Dr. E. B. Hart of Harvard University, who has been secured to deliver the main address. Dr. Hart will speak on "Practicality in Education," a subject near to the heart of every teacher. Unusual arrangements are being made to entertain the visiting teachers by the Omaha members. A banquet will be given on Friday evening and a luncheon Saturday noon. The meeting is the first of a series of spring meetings planned by the Association, which is subsidiary to the Nebraska State Teachers' Association. Most of the meeting will be given over to the discussion of methods for teaching Greek History. On Saturday afternoon an actual recitation, conducted by Dr. Fred Fling of Nebraska University, will be the feature of the program. Arrangements for the meeting are in charge of Mrs. Ada L.
