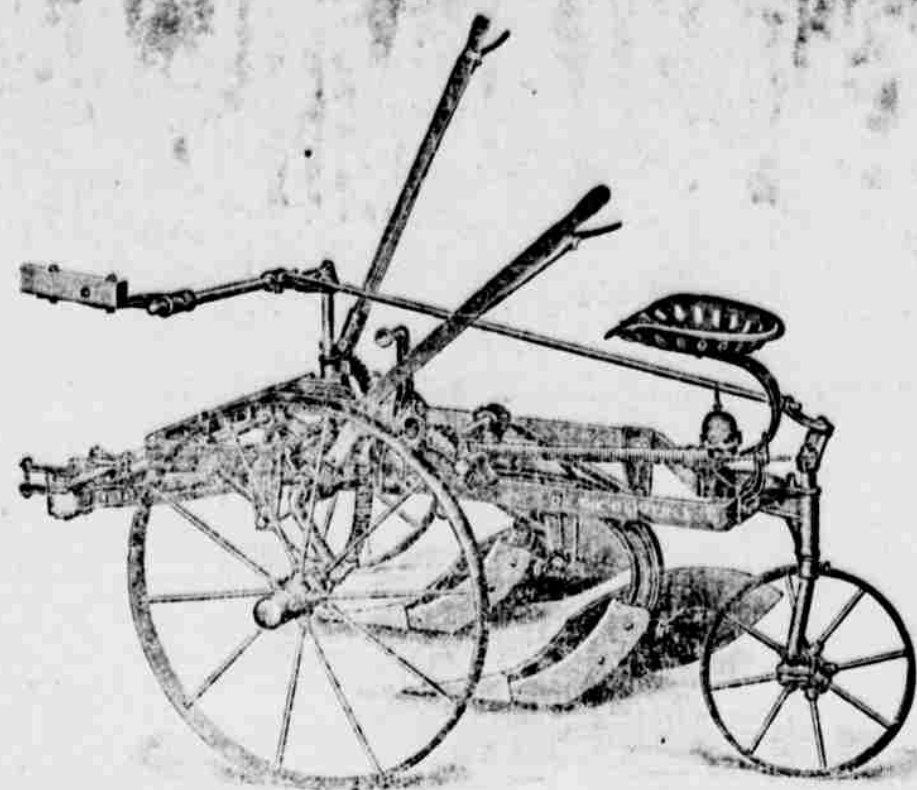

On motion appointments were approved.

D. H. Rich asked permission to have his annual report read before making the appointment of superintendent of water and light department.
Mr. Rich read his annual report to the council.
Mark Hay was appointed superintendent of the light and water department at \$125 a month.
A. C. Slaby was appointed marshal and night watch at \$60 a month.
On motion appointments were confirmed.
Application of Parks and Havel for billiard and pool hall, read, and on motion carried.
Application of W. W. Means for billiard and pool hall, read, and on motion carried.
Bonds of O. C. Teel as city clerk, and S. R. Florance as city treasurer, read, and on motion approved.
