Nebraska bankers, assembled in convention in Omaha on August 26 and 27, pledged their assistance, financial and otherwise, to agricultural development in the state. They pledged financial aid to the State University, and to all other movements which have for their purpose the increase of grain yields in the state. "Co-operation with the agriculturists" was the theme of the convention and without exception every banker in the state gave it favorable consideration.

Six hundred bankers from all parts of the state attended the convention. An interesting development of the meeting was that seventy-five per cent of the bankers were or had been farmers at some time of their careers. Hence, their co-operation was easily secured.

Omaha bankers tendered the visitors a banquet Tuesday night, at the Field club, and on Monday evening, the money magnates roared the Ak-Sar-Ben goat.
