### Nine Votes Puts Red Cloud In the Wet Column

In the city election held here Tuesday the people changed the policy from dry to wet by nine votes. The wet vote in the first ward was fourteen less than last year but it was thirtyone more in the second ward than the vote of one year ago. Don Saunders was elected mayor, S. W. Foe and J. D. Crans, aldermen of the first ward, Paul Storey alderman of the second ward, O. C. Teel, city clerk, S. R. Florance, Treasurer, G. H. Overing, city engineer, and James Burden, police judge. ### Red Cloud Aids Omaha Sufferers

A band concert was given in the opera house by the Red Cloud Concert Band, under the leadership of Prof. Betz, on Monday evening, the proceeds being turned over to the unfortunate Omaha tornado sufferers. Some of the business men devised this method of raising funds on Saturday, and bills and tickets were printed. The tickets were placed on sale at all of the business houses and sold at 25 cents a piece. There were 482 tickets sold which netted \$120.50. To this amount was added \$39.05, which was received from cash donations, making a total of \$159.55. Out of this was paid the expenses, a matter of only \$7.50, which left the neat sum of \$152.05 to send to the unfortunate ones of Omaha.

It was good to see our citizens respond to the call for aid and to Father Fitzgerald, F. W. Cowden and others, considerable credit is due for devoting no small amount of time to the distributing of the tickets, collecting the money, etc. Even though Red Cloud's donation may be a little, and perhaps, also, it may not be quite so large as some other towns of its size, it will at least show Omaha Red Cloud is on the map and is inhabited by people with real blood in their veins.

Mayor Turnure also appointed Messrs. J. H. Bailey and J. G. Potter as a committee to collect clothing, bedding, etc., and the citizens gave liberally along these lines.

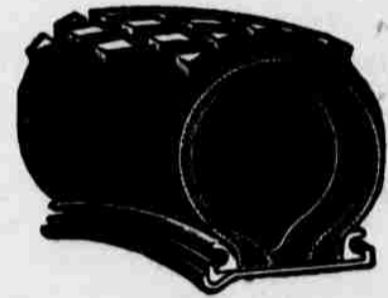
