It is desired to call attention to the Naturalization Laws, viz: Act of June 25, 1906. traveling at the rate of sixty miles an holders of certain declarations of intention.

By reason of this seven year limitation de-

clarations of intention filed shortly after the citizens should petition for naturalization before the validity of such declarations is terminated by the said seven year limitation. There is another matter of interest to aliens topic of conversation for the day and old law. The seven year limitation placed on deciarations of intention by said section 4

of the act of 1906, applies as well to old law declarations, except the said seven year limit did not begin to run against old law declarations until September 27, 1906, the date on which the above act became effective. All those who are owners of declarations of intention under the old law should file petitions for naturalization on or before September 26, 1913, if they wish to become citizens. as after that date said declarations will be of


