Said bonds to be sold not less than par value with ac, crued interest and proceeds thereof to be used by said city for the construction and establishing a system of sewerage in and for said city, said system not to include any lateral or district sewer; and shall the mayor and council of said city annually levy the necessary tax upon all the taxable property within said city, in addition to all other taxes, to pay the interest upon said bonds, as the same may become due and to furnish a sinking fund for the payment of the prinipal of said bonds, and an annual tax of not o exceed two mills on the dollar of assessed aluation of the property of said city for the purpose of maintaining and repairing said ystem of sewerage."

The form of the ballot to be used on said election shall be as follows:

For sewerage bonds and taxes... gainst sewerage bonds and taxes. And to be voted and marked by making a ross in the space provided in the usual manner as provided by law.
