

THE LAND BILL. The Opposition Made by the Ulster Members Solely to Satisfy Their Constituents.

The Bill Expected to go to the House of Lords by the Middle of July.

It will Probably Pass with but Very Few Amendments From Them.

LONDON, June 25.—The reported discontent among the Ulster members on account of Mr. Gladstone's alleged concessions to the landlords is more feebly than real. Their demonstrations on Thursday against the government, prolonged beyond patience, was intended to satisfy a portion of their constituents.
