Save the tin fruit-cans, and convert them into beautiful flower-pots in the following manner: With a can-opener cut off any rough or projecting portions of the cover, leaving a narrow rim to project inward. With a pair of pliers, or a small hammer, bend this rim down, and give it the shape of a shallow dish. Punch three or four small holes in the bottom of the can. Then paint it with varnish made of gum shellac dissolved in alcohol, and colored with lampblack and a little yellow ochre, to give a dark brown color. The cans may be ornamented by pasting on them little medallion figures or pictures. They are handsomer than the ordinary flower-pots, require less water, and keep the plants in better health, owing to the iron rust on the cans.

A STROG CEMENT.—A cement particularly adapted for attaching the brass-work to bottle necks, lamps, etc., is made by boiling three parts resin with one of caustic soda and five of water. The composition is then mixed with the weight of plaster of Paris. It sets firmly in about three quarters of an hour. It is said to be of great adhesive powers, not permeable by petroleum, is a low conductor of heat and is especially attacked by hot water.
