"Salt Lake, and probably the Pacific. They will head for Salt Lake, however, and will probably build on west. I am of the opinion, however, that they will go directly to the Pacific. This would seem to be the most practicable."

"Now, as you have seen both the Lone Pine route and the Poudre canon route, which do you consider the most feasible for a railroad?"

"A railroad could be built by either, but the Poudre route is the best by great odds," continued the official. "First, the grades are lighter and the distance much shorter. The routes, however, would not interfere with the building of the lines if they conclude to build."

"That would be my idea, and in fact, as but one line can go through by either route, it is highly probable that would be the solution. If one road builds west the other will. One of the roads will commence operation soon, and no mistake."

"How long would it take to complete a line by this route?"

"From three to four years—possibly shorter, according to the way it was pushed. I would say that one of these lines would be completed inside of three years, at the latest. The indications are such, and preparation are being made by the companies for the same."
