LOVE AND LEAD.

They Both Struck a Young Man in the Heart and He Fell Dead.

Lee DeLong the Name of This Latest Suicide--A Strange Ending of Life.

Yesterday afternoon a young man named C. L. DeLong, better known by his friends as Lee DeLong, killed himself by a shot from his revolver, near Broadway and Seventh street.

It appears that DeLong had for some time been paying special attention to Miss Mattie Gillam, who, with her sister, is engaged in the laundry business there.

Yesterday afternoon young DeLong called on the girls, and acted very strangely. Some say that he had been drinking, others that he must have been crazy. He asked if they knew where Winchester's brick yard was, a place with which he was perfectly familiar, as he had not only lived there for years, but worked in that very yard.

The young ladies who had taken refuge in the upper part of Mrs. Charles' house saw the shooting from an upper window. The scene was too much for Miss Martha, and the poor girl almost went into convulsions.

The revolver with which he did the deed was No. 22, and he kept it in his hand until he fell. He was a young man, aged only 22 years. His mother and step-father live in Madison county, Iowa.

Several others who were in the vicinity saw the young man as he shot himself, run and fall. Among those were George Peterson, Charles Thomas and George Marshall.
