FINANCIAL.

NEW YORK, October 2.
Money—Easy at 2 1/2 per cent, closed at 2 per cent.
Prime Paper—6 1/2 per cent.
Exchange bills—Weak at 4.82 1/2; demand, 4.85.
Governments—Strong.
Stocks—Another dull day in stock circles. At the opening the market was firm and higher, with a general advance in prices of 1/4 to 1 1/2 per cent, the latter for Western Union, on the favorable decision of the Court of Appeals legalizing \$15,520,000 of stock issued at the time of the consolidation of the American Union and the Atlantic & Pacific Telegraph companies with the Western Union in 1881. After 11 o'clock the market was quiet and steady, and continued so until the afternoon, when a sharp attack was made in Cleveland, Columbus, Cincinnati and Indianapolis, carrying the stock down from 6 1/4 to 5 1/2. This was followed by a general decline in the whole list of 1/4 to 2 per cent, Northwestern preferred suffering most. There was little recovery at the close. As compared with last night's close prices are down 1/4 to 2 per cent, except for Chicago, Burlington & Quincy, which is a fraction higher.

CLEARING HOUSE ASSOCIATION.

The clearing house association held their annual meeting to-day. The association consists of 63 members, including the Assistant Treasurer of the United States. The transactions for the past year were \$41,362,138.43; the daily average transactions were \$137,704.40, and the total transactions since organization in 1883 were \$715,201,940.337.

GRAIN AND PROVISIONS.

Special dispatch to THE BEE.

CHICAGO, October 2.

At the top of the bull this morning the market shook off the lethargy of the past few days, awoke into activity, and was at times excited. Trading in all commodities was brisk, especially in corn, which was the center of attraction for foreign and local speculators alike. The day belonged to the bears. Their movements amounted to a raid, and they forced a decline of about 1c in the principal cereals. There was, nevertheless, a bull element, which succeeded in recovering a portion of the extreme decline in corn. Foreign advices were firm, but the home markets were weaker. What opened active, but lower. The liberal offerings increased the decline to a point 1/2c below Monday's prices, but at the close a spurt by the buyers recovered 1/4c of the decline. Pork opened lively, and continued active throughout the session. Prices early in the day displayed a lower tendency, which was furthered by heavy offerings, and after some irregularity in the market there was a decline of fully 1c below yesterday's close, and was quiet at inside figures. The transactions were large, but entirely speculative, the shipping demand being small. Oats were exceptionally dull, prices weakened slightly, speculation was limited, and the cereal displayed not much life. Hog products were unsettled and rather weaker. Foreign advices were of a nature inclining the market to inactivity. The receipts were light, but the shipping demand was liberal. The stock of hog products is reported at 20,000,000 pounds in excess of the supply at the same time last year. Offerings of mutton were free. Owing to this fact prices declined 1/4c @ 1/2c on the whole range, and closed steady, with the transactions aggregating only a moderate amount.
