Laid Square, Level and Plumb.

Thursday morning October 11th, the day to which was postponed the ceremony of laying the corner stone of the new Masonic Temple...

On the third floor will be other offices, ante-rooms, etc., and the temple proper, which will be about 36 by 60 feet...
