FOILED POLICE. DUBLIN, October 29.—There was a public meeting of the National League anywhere in Ireland yesterday, the government forbidding them.

FRENCH ATROCITIES. PARIS, October 27.—Mail advices show that the French forces, in encounters in the vicinity of Hainor, early in September, met the Chinese regulars well armed and officered.

A RISE IN HAM.

A Gauzee Story From Milan County, Texas.

Five Hundred Negroes Under Arms for Civil Rights.

ST. LOUIS, October 29.—The Post-Dispatch prints a special from Austin, Tex., stating that intense excitement prevailed all last night and today in consequence of a telegram received by Gov. Ireland; that 500 negroes were under arms in the town of Gauzee, Milan county, and an outbreak was momentarily expected.

Terrific Explosion of Dynamite at Brooks Station, Pennsylvania.
