THE FRENCH POLICY.

PARIS, October 31.—In the Chamber of Deputies, to-day, Clemenceau, Radical, resumed debate upon the interpellation of the Government's Tonquin policy.

Premier Ferry, in reply to M. Clemenceau, admitted that the interests of the Cabinet were a secondary matter, compared with the interests of the country.

The explosions caused intense excitement in Irish circles in London. The Irish almost unanimously think the outrages were due to deliberately planned machinations of the enemies of the National party of Ireland.
