PROSPEROUS FARMERS.

What Inquiry Among Them Shows.

CHICAGO, November 7.—The Tribune of this city sent out a series of inquiries to correspondents throughout the Northwest touching upon the financial condition and prospects of farmers, merchants and manufacturers. The questions were: Are farmers selling their produce freely? What proportion of their products remain in their hands? Are present prices satisfactory to farmers? Are farmers borrowing more an usual from banks to carry their stock? Is money tighter or easier than at this time last year? Is merchant trade good? Are farmers paying their store bills promptly? Are stores overstocked with goods? Are manufacturers in your vicinity running on full time, half time or less than half time? Are the making good profits? What is the feeling about the future? To these questions replies have been received from every State in the Northwest and the results published last Saturday. Additional replies to the same questions are editorially referred to as follows. It will be seen that they are in accord with information previously obtained: "That back of the country is richer than ever before, farmers' products are still well in first hands, the weather in the agricultural districts in the Mississippi valley has been favorable, and they have, with surprising unanimity, invested out of their floating capital in new States and Territories West of the Missouri river. Depending upon these three great facts are a mass of interesting data, such as the inclination of farmers to do their own speculation in their own products, a temporary dullness till the farmer shall choose to sell, a general understanding of the situation by distributors and industrious efforts to the manufacturer to prepare himself for the demand which will be sure to come after so much temporary economy. Merchants nearly everywhere have shown that they were skilled in their calling and have bought only what they will sell. Money is nominally tighter than last year, because first-class borrowers are nearly all out of the market. Everywhere, practically, a good profit is being made and nearly every where the feeling is very hopeful.
