RAILROAD RACKET. A Gigantic Western War Likely to Follow the Union Pacific's New Alliance.

The announcement made in the Chicago Tribune of Sunday that a traffic agreement had been entered into between the Union Pacific, Rock Island, and Milwaukee & St. Paul caused considerable excitement, and still forms the principal topic of discussion in railroad circles.

MINNEAPOLIS, December 5.--A new railroad was organized in this city today, known as the Lake Traverse, Sanborn & Carrington road, which will run from the Northern end of Lake Traverse, on the boundary line between Minnesota and Dakota northwest, crossing the Northern Pacific at Sanborn and reaching Carrington in Foster county, Dakota, a distance of 170 miles.

The following officers were elected: President, C. H. Hall, vice-president, T. B. Casey, Treasurer, J. Christian. A preliminary survey has already been made and the work will be prosecuted as rapidly as possible. It is rumored that the Rock Island, which owns the greater part of the stock in the line, now extending from Sanborn northwest, will eventually be induced to extend its line northwest from Worthington, Minn., to connect with the projected road from Lake Traverse and purchase that road giving it a through line from northern Dakota to Chicago.

Wheat, Corn and Hogs. KANSAS CITY, December 5.--The Live Stock Indicator to-morrow publishes reports from about 80 counties of Kansas, Arkansas, Missouri, southwestern Nebraska and southeastern Iowa, which are unanimous in showing that winter wheat is going into the winter in a rank and vigorous condition probably never before equalled. The acreage has increased in every section, and the yield is better than for years past. The general trend, however, is that the present crop equals that of last year, though it is thought the quality in many localities is below the average. The weather has been unfavorable for drying out the corn, hogs, both fat and feeders, seem abundant and the prospect is good for a full supply in this market throughout the winter season.
