POSTAL TELEGRAPHY.

The Fight Against it Already Begun by Jay Gould's Monopoly.

Senator Hill's Bill to Annex the Telegraph System to the Postal Service.

WASHINGTON, D. C., December 7. [Special.]—Officials of the Western Union will spend the winter here to watch the bills for postal telegraphy. It is said that the Associated Press organization is of opinion that the adoption of a postal telegraph system would be injurious to its interests.

TEXT OF SENATOR HILL'S BILL. WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 7.—Senator Hill, of Colorado, who yesterday introduced a bill to establish a system of postal telegraphs in the United States, asked that it might lie on the table until he could address the senate on the importance of its passage.

MEANS OF TRANSMISSION. The postmaster-general is to ascertain the amount and character of the wires, apparatus and other facilities required for the prompt transmission by telegraph, telephone or other equivalent device between postal-telegraph offices to be established.

INTERCHANGE OF CORRESPONDENCE. The postmaster-general may negotiate with foreign governments or with persons or corporations owning ocean cables or telegraph lines in foreign countries for the interchange of telegraphic correspondence and money orders between the United States and such countries.

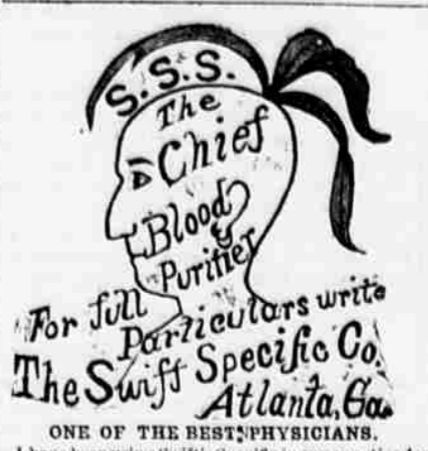
