entire list, although this decline was less im-
portant, except in the case of the Canadian
Pacific which broke 2 per cent. Market
closed weak, owing to rumors confirmed after-
noon of business that Cisco & Son had as-
signed. The firm has no outstanding con-
tracts with the stock exchange. Compared
with last night the closing prices are 1/2 to 2
per cent lower, except Denver, which is 1/2 per
cent higher.
