FORT WAYNE, January 16 .- The situation of the striking brakemon here remains unchanged. The only incident of note to-day was an effort of the city marshal, accomparied by three deputies, to serve warrants of accest on seven leaders of the strike. A large body of strikers immediately assembled, and would not allow the men to be taken, and the marshal wi horew. The mayor has called upon the entire night police force to report for duty this afternoon, when another effort will be made to move the freight trains from the yards, and the authorities will attempt to arrest all the strikers who interfers with the movement who interfers with the movement of the trains. The pay-car arrived and pa d off the employes as usual.

FORT WAYNE, IND., January 16.-At 3 o'cl ck this afternoon the third unsuccessful a tempt was made by the Pittsburg, Fort Wayus & Chicago railway officials to move the freight trains blockaded here, by reason of the brakemen's strike against the "double header" system of running freight trains. Supt. Law with Master Engineer Palamus attempted to take an engine from the round house to attach to a freight train they wis ed to send east. The strikers allowed them to take the engine and run it outside the round house, when several of the strikers sprang up on the engine and laid hold of the whistle and blew it vigorously. This was a signal for aid and was responded to quickly by other strikers scattered in and around the yards of the com-pany, guarding the switches. They compelled Mr. Polamus, who had the throttle of the enrine, to give the place to a striker, while the there assisted Mr. P. to dismount. A striker e'd his hanes over Pol-mus' eyes to prevent im from seeing who laid a hand on him. The gine was returned to the round house and he fire drawn. An Associated press reporter alled on the strikers this afternoon and intercalled on the strikers this afternoon and interviewed the leader at the headquarters in car No. 60. He said: "We gare peaceable men who desire to destroy no property, to haim no one, but will not allow the "double header" to leave Fr. Wayne under any circumstances. If we submit to "double headers" it throws many men who have families dipendent upon them out of work and those who do work can't live on the wages they earn. Business is light and brake.

work and those who do work can't live on the wages they carn. Business is light and brakemen under "double header" system cannot make more than one round trip per week, which would make their pay four dollars and eighty cents per week, and that wil not pay his board to say nothing of his family. Each of our men have signed a pledge not to tuch liquor while the strike lasts. If any man breaks the pledge we have a police force of our own who will arrest him and place him in our jail and keep him twenty-four hours or longer if need be. The machine hands and workmen in the several factories will aid us if need be in our efforts to maintain our principle. In






