NOW FOR BALLOTS.

A Special Election Called to Decide the Court House Question.

The Plans Accepted and a Limit Put to the Cost.

Facts and Figures.

An important decision was reached by the county board of supervisors yesterday, it being that a special election should be had and the question of building a new court house and jail submitted to the people. There were many reasons which led the board to this action.

The board of supervisors sworn as they are to look after the county's interest, find the county without any safe place for keeping either the valuable records, or keeping prisoners. The title of every man is in danger of being affected by the records being destroyed.

The sheriff yesterday presented the board some startling figures as to the cost of keeping the prisoners elsewhere. Unless a new jail is to be built this season they will certainly have to be kept somewhere else, and there is no place this side of Madison in the state, where accommodations can be had for them.

The plan for the jail is somewhat familiar to the public, as it has been on file here for some time. It is to be an iron revolving jail, the cell rooms being in three tiers, and so arranged that only one cell can be opened at a time, thus preventing all possible jail breaks.

The date fixed for the special election for building the court house and jail is Tuesday, March 10. Two distinct propositions are to be then voted on, one as to whether the board shall build a new court house, the other as to whether they shall build a new jail.

For building a new jail, it is proposed not to spend more than \$50,000. Bonds will be issued for the interest and which will be paid by the taxpayers.

jail is built. Then \$5,000 will be paid each year until all is paid off. The tax levy shall only be one-quarter of a mill a year to keep up the interest until the bonds become due.

The people have all the guarantees offered that they can ask. They have a board of supervisors of their own choosing, and one made up of men of known integrity and wisdom. They have plans presented showing just what kind of buildings they are to build.

The plans of Eckel & Mann, of St. Jo, which have been accepted by the board, are now filed with the county auditor and will be scanned with greater interest than ever.
