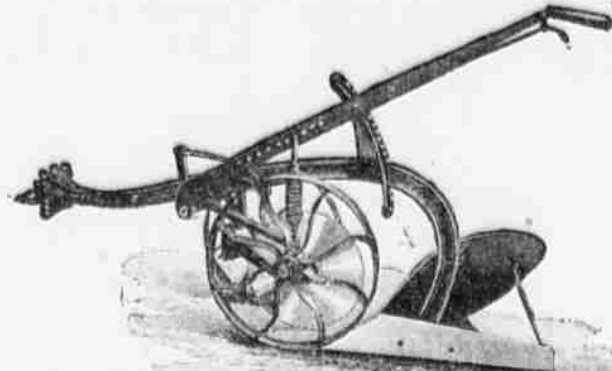

He at once entered into an agreement whereby he gave his wife \$75,000 in property and money, the stipulation being that she leave Denver and renounce all claims upon the Daniels estate in case of his death. The marriage contract was also to be annulled until such time as both parties, in writing, should signify an intention of entering into the marriage state again.
