Winter Quarters at Corinth—A Sample March—Who Got the Goose?—Shooting a Deserter.

VI. Following the battle of Corinth was the usual era of demoralization after an engagement. The men lived high on luxuries procured from abandoned sutler stores; clothing, blankets, and all kinds of personal effects could be had for the picking up, and for several days discipline was more lax.

At Corinth we erected comfortable winter quarters, four of us putting up a log house ten by twelve feet with a good fireplace at one end, two double bunks, table in one corner, carpeted floor, and canvas-lined walls.

Another of our tramps from Corinth, in February, 1863, we christened "the wet march." We left town aboard a freight train, and lattered ourselves before we had only a comfortable ride before us, but at the foot of the first up-grade we struck we had to "disembark."

During the summer of 1863 many of our men were shot on outpost duty, and it became very dangerous to be assigned to that service. It was considered that it was being done by parties fully acquainted with our guard lines and finally the mystery was solved by the capture of one Johnston, a member of company "D," First Alabama cavalry (unltd), of which regiment George Sponser, well known in Omaha and since the war senator from Alabama, was colonel.
