There are more stocks on what is generally considered the active list that show advances than declines, but extreme fluctuations have been kept within very narrow limits. At the opening, prices generally were a shade lower with two or three stocks as much as 1/4 per cent below the closing prices of last evening, from which there was a rally, then a slight decline, then on reports of impending war troubles in Europe another small advance, with the same show of an increase in trading in a few stocks, then extreme dullness and slight fluctuations until late in the afternoon, when prices generally yielded a fraction and the market closed weak.
