

A MAGNIFICENT STRUCTURE. The New Court House of Douglas County.

A Few Timely Remarks Thereon--General Description. Yesterday the offices of the county judge and the county superintendent of schools were moved from the old quarters in Creighton block to the new court house.

THE BUILDING ITSELF is of the massive classical style, 120x137 feet in size, there being eight stories, including the basement floor and the five stories of the tower or dome.

ENTERING THE BUILDING The first floor is found to be divided into four sections or quarters by two corridors which run transversely north and south, east and west, intersecting each other in the center.

LEAVING THE FIRST FLOOR by the heavy iron staircase, in the northwest section of the second floor, is the law library, separated by a small corridor from the grand jury, witness, and jury waiting rooms.

THE NEXT AND LAST STORY of the tower is very small. On each of the four sides of this story are placed the glass dial, five feet in diameter, of the monster clock which is to be placed, at some future date, on the fourth floor.

THE BUILDING IS HEATED by steam and ventilated according to the latest and most perfected plans. All partitions, of wood, metal and masonry, have been thoroughly concreted, making the structure absolutely fire-proof.

\$250,000, of which one half, or \$125,000 has already been paid in cash out of the general fund of Douglas county.

"KIDNAPPED" BY FARRELL. McFarland, Discharged by Judge Stenberg, is Seized,

Placed in a Hack and Driven Across to Iowa--The Law in the Case.

Yesterday morning another exciting chapter was added to the now celebrated habeas corpus case of "McFarland, Morgan-Moore."

The moment that McFarland was discharged by the court, he was gobbled up by the ever alert Sheriff Farrell, who was watching for his prey.

In the first stages of the case, Detective Nelligan had advised Sheriff Farrell to seize his man on the first opportunity presented, without reference to the action that might be taken by any local tribunals.
