BIG BLAZE IN A WAREHOUSE

Orchard & Wilhelm Lose Considerable of Their Surplus Stock.

Damage Amounts to More Than \$10,000 with Loss Well Covered by Insurance—No Knowledge of Its Origin.

A brick warehouse at 1124 North Fourteenth street, used by the Orchard & Wilhelm Carpet company for the storage of furniture, was discovered on fire at 4:15 yesterday and the contents were seriously damaged.

An alarm was telephoned in and four streams were thrown into the building, a pipe inserted through a hole hewn in the roof at the seat of the fire doing especial service.

The contents of the building had just been transferred from a former farmhouse of the company near Tenth and Farnam streets.

The building had been previously damaged by the fire in the warehouse, which still had sixty-five tons of the roof stored in the building.

The cause of the fire has not been explained. Weaving, the cabinet maker, says that the origin was apparently in the west-end part of the building, which is closely packed with bedsteads.
