Free Movement of New Crop Continues to Weaken Wheat.

JULY AND SEPTEMBER AGAIN SHOW LOSS

All Other Markets Are Likewise Weaker, and Corn and Oats and All Provisions Have Lower Quotations.

CHICAGO, July 13.—Indications of the free movement of the new crop and favorable reports from the harvest fields were evident wheat today. July left off to lower end September last. Corn and oats down, estimated by each. Pork closed 25¢ down, estimated by each.

Higher Liverpool cables and confirmation of heavy export business at the seaport yesterday, together with advices from New York that the foreign demand was still unsatisfied, started wheat strong.
