SUPREME COURT SYLLABI. Mankos against Brown, Appeal from Mackay county. Reversed, Harrison, C. J.

1. Ballots cast at an election and which were introduced in evidence and counted during the trial of a contest held at the close of the trial placed in the proper receptacles, sealed and delivered to the officer of the county in whose custody they were to be kept.
