WORK OF BUREAU OF LABOR

Commissioner Kent Prepares Statement for the Paris Exposition.

PROSPEROUS CONDITION OF THE TOILERS

Few Unemployed and Those Working Receive Good Wages—Railroad Labor Best Paid of Any in the State.

LINCOLN, Jan. 20.—(Special.)—Deputy Labor Commissioner Kent has prepared for the Paris exposition the following statement relative to the work of the Nebraska State Bureau of Labor:

"The Bureau of Labor and Industrial Statistics was organized in 1887, following the agitation of the labor unions and the Knights of Labor for departments in the state and national government that should inquire into the relation of capital and labor, the wages paid, the hours worked, etc., together with the gathering of such facts as would show the moral, educational and physical conditions of the industrial classes.

Several Good Laws Enacted

"Since the foundation of the bureau several very valuable laws advocated by the department have been passed and while their passage cannot be ascribed entirely to its work, yet the bureau was a prominent factor in their consummation.

Wages Do Not Differ Radically from What They Were Ten or Twelve Years Ago

Comparative few workmen own their own homes. From 1893 to 1897 there were many men unemployed owing to the panic.

Wages of Domestic Labor

"Wages of domestics range from \$1.50 per week up to \$5, with an average of about \$3 per week.

Farm Laborers Receive an Average Wage of About \$15 per Month

"The working force of the bureau of labor is the deputy commissioner at a salary of \$1,500 per year, a chief clerk at a salary of \$1,000 per year and a stenographer at a salary of \$500 per year.
