

WILL MEET IN CONFERENCE

Meeting of Officials of Union Pacific and Western Connections.

EVERAL IMPORTANT PLANS UNDER WAY

Possibility that Union Pacific May Close Ogden Gateway to Rio Grande Western—Plan to Remove Auditing Office.

From Salt Lake comes the report that the meeting of officials of the Union Pacific, Oregon Short Line and Oregon Railway and Navigation company to be held in that city next Wednesday will witness the consummation of several important projects.

One of the questions which it is reported will be taken up by the officials of these lines will relate to the recent order consolidating the general agencies at Portland, Butte and Salt Lake City, whereby one general agent will represent the three lines instead of maintaining separate agencies as heretofore.

Such action, it is understood, will involve the closing of the Ogden gateway for the reason that the Union Pacific has about concluded it should haul all the freight from the Missouri river to points west of Ogden, since no plan is in effect to connect the Missouri river with the freight receipts of the Rio Grande Western and its connections.

In Omaha considerable interest is manifested in this projected movement for the reason that it is believed matters of undoubted importance to this city may come up for consideration. It is still maintained in reliable quarters here that certain departments of the Oregon Short Line are to be removed from Salt Lake to Omaha, notably the auditing department.

Crepe on Commission Voucher. A few commission vouchers continue to be received at the general headquarters of the Union Pacific from ticket agents at various points in the country.

Revision of Coal Rates. The lines operating between Omaha and Chicago are arranging a new schedule on coal, affecting the rates between Chicago and all points west of the Missouri river.

Ticket Agents Have Hope. A prominent Omaha city ticket agent expressed the opinion yesterday that the abolishment of commissions would not long continue in effect, basing his assertion upon this statement: "The Canadian Pacific has refused to enter into the combination for the abolishment of commissions and this refusal, I believe, will force all the other roads to re-establish the commission plan."
