**Former Holt Rancher
Dies at 73**

ATKINSON — Funeral services were conducted at the Seger funeral chapel here Saturday, November 23, for John F. Dierks, 73, former Atkinson rancher. He died late Wednesday, November 20, of a heart attack at the Thompson nursing home at St. Edward.

Rev. Curtis Bennett, pastor of First Presbyterian church, officiated. Burial was in Woodlawn cemetery.

The late Mr. Dierks was the oldest son of the late Daniel and Christina Dierks. He was born in Dodge county in 1884, came to Holt county at the age of 10 with his parents, settling 16 miles southwest of here.

John and his brother, the late Clarence Dierks, operated the ranch for a number of years, then left the community. He spent most of the past 25-30 years at Norfolk. He never married.
