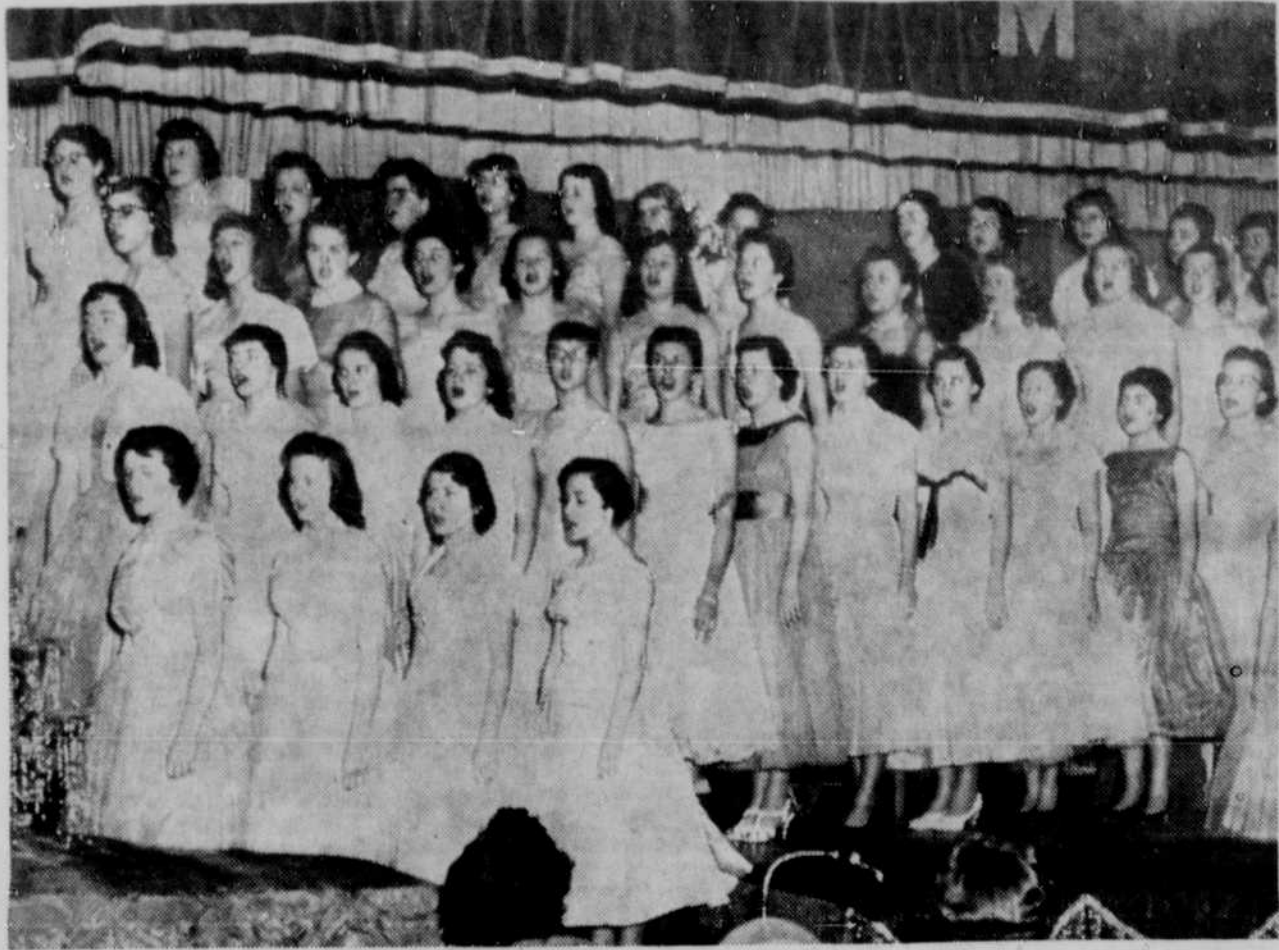
**Cadwalladers Move to Remodeled Home—**

Pastor Roten led the devotionals. His topic was "The Ladies Aid and Its Activities."

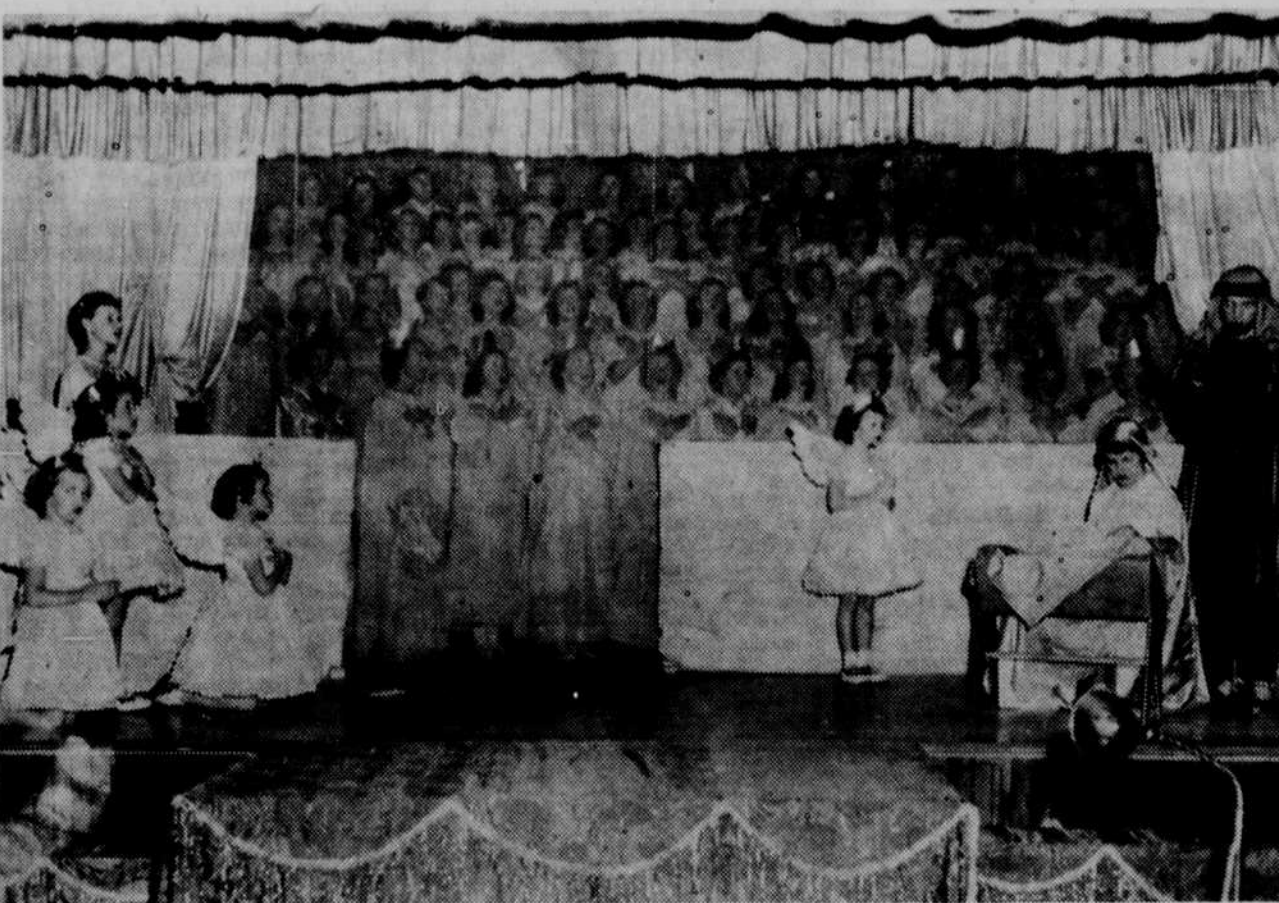
