

Poinsettias Take Boughs



What would Christmas be without poinsettias? They are as much a part of the holiday scene as holly wreaths and Christmas trees, lending a warm and festive touch wherever they are placed. Because of their great beauty and popularity, they make perfect Christmas gifts for business or personal friends - to give or wire any place in the country or overseas. Alyn Wayne, official stylist for the Florists' Telegraph Delivery Association, has designed here an arrangement of white poinsettias and fir boughs suitable for home or office. Particularly note the fact that the arrangement is of cut poinsettias, disproving the general opinion that once cut, they die. The secret is in the handling before arranging: Soak your plant heavily overnight, then cut and dip immediately in alcohol from 5 to 10 minutes. This sears the cads, and your poinsettias should last in arrangement from 1 to 3 weeks, depending on the woodiness of the stem. Try it yourself.
