### Ainsworth Clinic for Children Planned

The next extension clinic to be held in this area for Crippled Children will be at the elementary grade school in Ainsworth Saturday, March 29. Clinic registration begins at 7 a.m., and all registrations should be completed by noon.

The clinic is for diagnosis, consultation, checkup and after-care services for children now receiving treatment and will be conducted by Dwight W. Burney, M. D., of Omaha, orthopedist, and Kenneth J. Flynn, M.D., of Lincoln, pediatrician.

The counties of Antelope, Boyd, Brown, Cherry, Holt, Keya Paha, Knox, Rock and Wheeler are to be served by this clinic.

Referral blanks can be obtained from the local doctors and should be completed and mailed promptly to the County Welfare office as will permit clearance with the services for crippled children division, Lincoln, prior to the clinic. The practice of sending the referral with the patient is undesirable but may be necessary in some cases. It is very important that a referral be furnished, even if the patient does have to bring it to the doctors.  
A noon lunch will be furnished to all children and their parents who have registered at the clinic.
